



## "NÍL AON GLEANNTÁN MAR DO GLEANNTÁN FÉIN" GLOUNTHAUNE NEWS BY "THE FOREIGN CORRESPONDENT"

## **A LOOK BACK**



The "Altar Boys" at Glounthaune, no "Altar Girls" in the old days, were featured here in the past and similar to priests: there is presently a very declining number. This is not just at Glounthaune and incidentally; was the "Altar Boys" role diminished somewhat when the celebration of the Vernacular Mass was introduced at several stages during 1965; the initial was on the "First Sunday of Lent", March 7th? Prior to this; the Latin Tridentine had been the most widely celebrated Mass in the world since 1570. Billy Lyons, a Rougrane native is now a blogging expert, his main subject being restaurants / food and in this regard perhaps the fact that he sold rabbits in the area for a half crown back in the fifties gave him a "flavour" for this, and it is far from rabbit food that Billy is now evaluating! Another one of his blogs includes some very interesting descriptives of his Glounthaune days in the fifties and sixties. He speaks of his time as an altar boy and remarks that being an altar boy then was part and parcel of growing Glounthaune. He says that there was the occasional lucrative big day when serving at the Stations or at Weddings and Billy also refers to what he describes as lighter moments, such as his confirmation day. He says that "Altar Boys" for confirmation were dressed in their altar outfits which were collected at the church on the day. He recalls the village mothers' ensured that their fellows got there first and all that was left for him was a wickedly wrinkled soutane and surplus. Billy says that he didn't take too much notice but; "mother was not very happy when she saw the Glounthaune boys in such wellironed outfits"! There are some humorous stories pertaining to the "Altar Boys" of Glounthaune not least the time when one had to help rescue the plus eighty year old Canon's sister who was residing at the Parochial House and was confined to bed. The Canon was hospitalised at the time and one morning the housekeeper, priests had housekeepers in those days, closed the windows and the ground floor shutters, locked the doors and for unknown reason vanished and never returned. A local observed this scene later that afternoon so the "Village Ladder & Rescue Team" was summoned. It was noticed that one window on the upper floor was partially open and the female leader of the rescue party ventured up the steps of the ladder and prised the window to a fully open position. However calamity struck while attempting to enter; the heavyset volunteer got stuck in the opening and was unable to get in or out. A local altar boy, they were multifunctional then, was asked to assist and picture the scene that confronted this young lad. The female would-be rescuer was akin to a performer at Duffy's Circus as she balanced high above with most of her anatomy inside and her legs dangling outside which resulted in a display of an enormous pair of blue coloured bloomers. The size was probably equivalent to a couple of dozen pairs of todays' flimsy micro variety apparently! Anyway, the young lad slowly climbed the ladder and with a tug "here" and "there" finally managed to free the unfortunate heroine to outside freedom. He then entered the house via the same window opening and proceeded through darkness to the ground floor. He was able to open the door from inside thus enabling the rescue team enter and urgently attend to the Canon's sister. It is said was the least that she traumatised by the day's event and there was no counselling in those days! Another true story relates to an incident at an eight, fifteen am morning mass. The congregation was small; principally women who attended daily and they each had "their own" seat. In fact they also had their "own position" at the Altar Rails when receiving Eucharist and on one particular morning this usual practice was followed. Prior to distribution the priest, Fr. Deasy, facing the

people, which only occurred a few time in the Latin Mass era. and holding the Host recited; "Ecce Agnus Dei" and on behalf of the congregation he responded; "Domine Non Sum Dignus". This was recited three times; the priest facing centre, then left to the Epistle side, right to the Gospel side and the altar boy rang the bell each time. Now the bell at Glounthaune back then was a large circular brass one with a cross at the centre top where the altar boy positioned his hand while using the other hand to strike the bell with a mallet / pom. It is similar to the one presently at Knock Basilica but no doubt it is not the same one! Fr. Deasy had just recited the first of three and having struck the bell; the mallet / pom left the altar boy's grasp and travelled at high speed towards the pious women kneeling at the Altar Rails. Luckily it just about cleared the head of one and because of her reverence state she was totally unaware of how close she was to suffer the same fate as St. John the Baptist when beheaded circa AD 30. It was very similar to the first Soviet Scud missile of a few years previous in 1953 but the propellant was not the Kerosene and Nitric Acid used then but rather a perspiring hand! The lady's name was never disclosed but, and it is relevant to note, that the nearmiss occurred at the late Mrs. Cashman's (of Rockgrove) "own position" at the Altar Rails! There were two more "strikes" of the bell that is, required and Fr. Deasy observed and admired in awe as the enterprising altar boy applied his hand-pass Gaelic Football skill, introduction of the present-day style, by giving the bell two thumps with his clenched fist. Fr. Deasy and the altar boy recalled this incident with humour on many occasions and it is said that when it was relayed some years later to the unsuspecting would-be victim; she prayed to St. John the Baptist every day thereafter! "The Canon's Car" is another story. Incidentally, historically Glounthaune's parish priest was a Canon of the Cathedral Chapter but is not Canon Mc Swiney, who died fifty years ago in 1972 and there has been eight appointees since, the last Canon to serve as parish priest of Glounthaune? Anyway, Canon Mc Swiney had a black "Opel Rekord" car with column gear

change, full width bench seat and the vehicle's registration number was CIF 83. The Canon was partaking on a two week retreat one particular year and he gave a local altar boy the keys of his car and asked him to turn the ignition on a daily basis to ensure that the battery would not go flat. Now the Canon was very helpful as he showed the altar boy how to open the door of the car, where the ignition was and how to turn the key. The altar boy duly carried out the instructions for the first week or so and then the thought struck him; if the car can be started surely there would be no problem in driving it! The car was in the garage and the task of finding reverse gear failed but this was easily overcome; there was a decline from the garage so by disengaging the hand brake and with hands on the steering wheel, he was familiar with both from his visits to Mc Cormack's dodgems at the "Small Field", the car reversed well and ended up in a drive forward position. He proudly motored safely through the village and the fact that it was his first time in the front seating of a car made it that extra special. Some of the village residents astonished to observe the car moving along as it appeared there was no driver and they thought they were witnessing the Third Secret of Fatima! This illusion was due to the fact that the altar boy had sunk so deeply into the bench seat that his head was barely visible. He went from first to third gear, as he could not find second or later fourth but he considered such surplus to requirements anyway as the car was moving. He turned left at the Bridge, on towards Burys Bridge, a right and another right to Caherlag. A friend came on board and onwards to Combermere Lodge for another and this was followed by the Windsor Hill circuit experience. The car was eventually "driven" back to base and it had just about cooled down before the Canon's arrival back a few days later. He asked if it "turned over" all right - "oh fine" said the altar boy, reflecting that it literally nearly did at Burys Bridge! Was this the original joyriding incident in Ireland?!



## RED ROBIN CHARM

In sombre, darkened gardens,(due perhaps to the shade set by buildings, shrubbery, or street planting) it is possible to depend solely on leaves to provide light, colour, interest, and movement, apart altogether from any blooms which may be produced. In fact, good foliage can be far better than the rather ephemeral blooms produced on most trees and

In Japan, the one country where gardening was always regarded as one of the fine arts (reaching a degree of sophistication it has never really attained in Europe), foliage has always been regarded as being more important than

Given that it can be guite difficult to choose modest sized trees with good foliage for today's smaller, and more compact gardens, we are obliged to turn to hedging and shrubs with an interesting coloured leaf.

A number of these can burgeon out in delicate shades of red or vivid lemon instead of green, and of these, the one which outshines all the others is the easily recognized

'Red Photinia fraseri boasting highly polished, floortile coloured waxy-how they are pruned and trained. Like hawthorn, they will in time produce flowers, but not until the large, laurel-like leaves have in their maturity turned a deep mid-green. In infancy and in youth however, these are admired for their rich red gloss and it is these that the gardener wants to encourage and maintain.



The perfect winter hedge? Photinia Red Robin. Properly pruned and cared for (as in this garden) it has no equal.

This is achieved by pruning (and the training of wayward shoots when being grown as a hedge) but the big question is "when does the actual reduction, pruning, and training take place?

At a recent presentation, I suggested the period early September (just as the semimature leaves begin to put on a green appearance) as the optimum time for just such an undertaking. Done then, the plants will have enough time to put out fresh new growth, making a splendid addition to the early autumn garden. Do no further pruning during either autumn or winter, tidying the plants only when spring arrives.

A sunny site is probably best in encouraging this shrub to produce the best results. Any reasonable garden soil will suffice but please avoid heavy clay. The shrub is generally totally hardy but sometimes, the young foliage tips can be burned by severe late spring frosts.

Cuttings of Red Robin are best taken during mid-summer and if placed in a free draining compost should be well rooted by late autumn. Allow three years before you have a proper plant which can develop into an impressive clump, but the delay is worthwhile. Grown as a hedge, Red Robin will be found to have all the virtues and none of the vices usually associated with hedges such as laurel

## **AUTUMN WELCOME**

Autumn, as in every year, is the most contradictory of seasons! It has far more warmth and sunshine than is popularly allowed and was particularly evident this year in the glorious months of August and September. As a season, and September as a season, and september as a season, and september are season. it is profoundly senescent and sweet smelling of corruption, but sadly, also filled with treasured departures.

Whether we greet, or detest its arrival, it is as inescapable as winter. It begins, traditionally in the month of August, but as the days move into September and October they become noticeably shorter and indeed cooler. Flowers seem to sense the change and try their utmost to produce as much seed as possible in the hope that their offspring, will next year be more bountiful than themselves.

The first garden indications of autumn are the early morning cobwebs strung from every shrub and perennial. The handiwork of the Orb spider, these webs are creations of wonder and beauty, the intricate designs showing up readily on dew-laden mornings. For all that, it's the chilling of

the air, and a clinging dampness creeping up from the soil that alerts the gardener to the distinct change of atmosphere, not to mention the arrival of oddly familiar, and sometimes strangé scents.

Rripeness is the key element to these powerful odours: mixtures of plenty and decay. They also contain remnants (and memories) of a waning summer left in the fragrance of roses, lilies, marigolds, chocolate cosmos, dahlias, phlox, and agapanthus. All these, mixed with the sugar-sweet aroma which rises now from scarified and recovering lawns. (That severe heat played havoc with well-tended swards.)

Yet I love these smells, many with their subtle, musky, rotting aromatic exhalation, but I prefer to contemplate what lies ahead now instead of retiring and sulking over those lost and decidedly past their best. There really is no future in the past.

I welcome now the predominance of pastel shades, coupled with soft blue, for these give an incredible lift to the entire garden. When deep colours begin to recede into

the darkness, pale blues and indeed whites glow with subtle illumination.

I have found this illumination to be particularly powerful with the mauve-blue of Geranium 'Jolly Bee' and the superior lace cap blooms of Hydrangea villosa, both of which maintain a ghostly gleam until darkness finally descends. Delicate pastel shades on the last Campanula lactiflora plantings also hold out well against the twilight. All campanulas are similarly endowed.

Of course, white will readily grace any garden at sunset and indeed long after. A white garden is an exciting place to wander through on warm evenings especially when there is a full moon due. Nothing of consequence beats the mophead hydrangeas for evening impact and the generous billowing clouds of Madame Emile Mouillere are outstanding for sustaining pools of brightness well into the night. The same can be said about the rather drooping 'Annabel' whose creamy blooms are as large as sticks of candy floss and equally as soft.




