

Another record attendance turned up at White's Cross GAA grounds on St. Stephen's Day morning for our annual Poc Fada. Well done to everyone who participated and made this our biggest Poc Fada yet. In addition, for the first time, we also had our first Poc Fada Beag for the younger members in our Club and it was great to see so many girls and boys in attendance there too - thanks to all involved in its organisation.

Well done in particular to our winning teams. We had Kathleen Hickey and her children Karen, Derek and Gillian and extended members of the family on hand to present the John Hickey Perpetual Cup to the overall winners in the adult category. John had been a key member of White's Cross GAA for most of his life until his sudden death eighteen years ago. The winners of this cup were Barry Hegarty, Padraic Kelleher and James Cussen. However they had to dig deep to take the top spot two teams ended up on the same lowest score and so both teams had to nominate a team member to take one winner-takes-all longest shot. We had to leave the comforts to run off this competition and James Cussen's shot was longer than that of the eventual runners up comprised of Nathan Lowry, Shane Hegarty and Timmy Hegarty.

In 2022 we also had a newly commissioned perpetual presented to the overall juvenile winners. This cup was very generously put forward by Don and Emma O Connell and family, in memory of their son Rowan who died tragically in April 2021. It's a particularly fitting way of remembering Rowan on this St. Stephen's Day event given that his birthday was one day later -December 27th – may Rowan rest in peace. The winning Juvenile team was Liam Hooley, David Lynch and Cárthach Kelleher.

The girls' contest was also nip-andtuck and here again we had more drama - another play-off! With two girls' teams coming in on the same lowest score we had each of the girls' take a single shot, outside the Boothouse, to decide the outcome. After 3 years of disappointment in the Intermediate County Final, 2023 was a year to remember! Glanmire played 2022 Junior All Ireland runners up, Naomh Aban in the County Final. This game went down to the wire and with minutes to go our girls looked like they were heading for their 4th County Final loss but some late scores put them ahead to final take County honours and headed for Munster Championship.

Glanmire had good wins over Gaultier of Waterford and Boherlahan Dualla of Tipperary and would meet the Limerick Champions in the Final, who themselves had lost the 2022 Munster Final. After a slow start the girls went in at half time behind but a huge effort in the second half with an inspiring score from Abbie O' Mahony saw the girls drive on and take home the Munster Intermediate Cup. Glashaboy Flood Relief Scheme

Glashaboy Flood Relief Scheme Works Update Hazelwood Road/R639




Works are continuing in Sallybrook Industrial Estate, Meadowbrook Estate, and adjacent to O'Connor's Funeral Home as part of the Flood Relief Scheme.

Over the coming months, works are also being carried out at the Hazelwood Road/R639 Junction, to facilitate the realignment of this junction. See Fig One Below.

These works at the R639 will entail the construction of the following:-

- · A right turn lane, northbound
- · A left turn filter lane Southbound
- The construction of a cycle lane, both northbound and southbound
- The installation of traffic lights at this junction
- The construction of pedestrian crossings
- The construction of a footpath on the right-hand side heading Southbound
- The construction of a new bus stop (where the existing bus stop is currently closed)
- The installation of new drainage in the entre area in conjunction with the Flood Relief Scheme
- The construction of a new culvert at Cois Na Ghleann



It will be necessary to have ongoing Traffic Management in this area going forward, to enable Sorensen to carry out these works in a safe and timely manner.

This will include Stop/Go during peak hours, and automated Traffic Lights during off peak hours. Sorensen will endeavour to keep disruption to a minimum, but unfortunately, there maybe delays/disruption to the flow of traffic, especially at peak times.

We would ask you to please allow extra time for your journey particularly during school time, from 8am – 9am. Or alternatively, if possible, to take another route.

Writer's Corner

Hope you are keeping warm this February and looking forward to brighter spring days ahead.

My name is Eleanor O'Kelly-Lynch and I'm a writer and the author of two women's fiction books published over the last 15 months. I live here in Glanmire and I know there are many writers and would-be-writers out there who'd like to know more about the craft of writing – short stories, poetry, or novel-writing – and aren't sure of where and how to begin.

Over the next few months, I plan to talk about all things writing: how to get started, tips on writing style, developing your characters and how to create a vision board to inspire you. I'll tell you about my own writing journey and I'll recommend the self-help writing books I've found useful. I'll also take you through the process of publishing a book and the steps involved in getting from your idea stage right through to seeing your novel on the bookstore shelves.

Like any habit, the writing habit is a muscle – the more you use it, the stronger it becomes. The trick is to carve out a little time every week to sit down and write even if it's only 20 minutes. It's a start and your confidence and creativity will grow week-on-week. It's about taking the first step and building from there. And why would you bother? It's a good question and one that you have to answer for yourself – 'what's in it for you?'

For myself, I've always liked to write. When I was a child I loved to read for hours, immersing myself in the fascinating worlds of Hans Christian Andersen's fairytales, English boarding schools, the Famous Five adventures and fantasy worlds like Narnia. They all fired my imagination and got me writing my own stories but it took me many years to eventually sit down and write my first novel.

Writing can be fun, therapeutic, satisfying. It can help us expand our imagination and to know the thrill of creating something from nothing. Think about what might motivate you and that's what will keep you going.

A few tips on getting started or restarted:

- 1. Set a goal say 20 minutes writing once a week. Give something up like ironing and spend the time saved quietly writing!
- 2. Set your smartphone stopwatch for 7 minutes. Don't lift your pen from your page for the seven minutes. Don't stop, judge or edit, keep writing even if you think (and you will) what you're writing is absolutely worthless.
- 3. If you haven't a clue what to write just write something like, I haven't a clue what to write about though I noticed a man walking ahead of me today in Supervalu and . . . continue on, describing the man, how he spoke, what you found intriguing about him. After some meandering, you will be off, following him out of the store and on and until the seven minute bell sounds.
- 4. Go back over what you've written and underline any words or phrases that grab your attention. See if you might find an ending for this story or a way to develop the plot.
- 5. You now have something to edit and rewrite for your next session. If you do this exercise, feel free to send your revised version to me by email, I'd love to read your stories.




The main characters are Katniss and Peeta who are both put in the arena and have a plan to win over the Capitol audience in the hope it will give them an edge in the competition.


